


BCD focuses on the creation of new jobs and investment through domestic and international business recruitment, expansion and retention; increasing Texas exports; and small business development and entrepreneurship.

Texas' population grew more in 2023 than any other state, for the 18th year in a row.




With a population of 30.5 million, Texas is a popular location for talent to relocate.




Texas has added nearly 4.8 million new residents since 2010—more than California and New York combined.


